What you can do to help at home:

English

To start off the Spring Term, Jackdaws class are going to be looking at a wonderful non-fiction book called Rainforest Rough Guide and creating our own pages in the style of this. Following that, a lovely collection of poems called Carry Me Away. In the second half of the spring term, our focus books are going to be Leon and the Place Between and 13 Words. These last two books are wonderful fiction books, if not a little bit whacky!

DT:

Our topic this half term links really nicely with our science topic as we will be looking at structures. We will learn about the features of a castle before designing and making our of our own. We will even practise our knowledge of making nets from before Christmas!

Art

The two art skills that we are going to be practising this term are Drawing and Sculpture. Before half term, our focus artist is **Brunel** and his landmarks. We will be having a go at precise line drawing and 3D affects.
