What you can do to help at home:

- ≈ Practise reading at home for 15-20 minutes per day - reread your colour book band book when you've finished it once to practise fluency, prosody and comprehension.
- ≈ Learn key maths facts: number bonds to 10, 20, 100; counting in 2s, 5s, 10s; knowing odds and evens, doubling and halving, finding 1 more or less etc.
- ≈ Practise your weekly spellings and words from the Year 3/4 statutory word list.
- ≈ Practise times tables (using Times Tables Rock Stars or another method or game).
 - Year 2 End of Year expectation:
 - recall of 2s, 5s, 10s, multiplication and division facts.
 - Year 3 End of Year expectation:
 - recall of 3s, 4s, 8s, multiplication and division facts.
 - Year 4 End of Year expectation:
 - instant recall of all tables and facts!(And a statutory assessment.)

Geography/ History (SS)


We will be celebrating our History learning from last term with a trip to Merrivale—the very monuments we have been learning about... can't get more hands on than that! We will be starting off our humanities learning this term with history topic with the big question "How do artefacts help us to understand the lives of people in ancient Britain?" in the context of the Iron Age. In the second half of the term, we will be looking at a geography topic based on megacities, working to be able to answer the question: "Why do so many people live in megacities?"

Maths

We will begin the term by getting our fractions knowledge as secure as possible, before linking it to decimals. Decimals knowledge will be an important feature in our learning this term, as we will be doing learning based on length and perimeter, mass and capacity and money, which can (and will!) all feature decimals. As the term comes to an end, we will be focusing on statistics, position and direction and finally, time. Time is <u>always</u> a tricky one, because it is such an abstract concept to try and understand, which is why we revisit it each year.

Science (JH)

This term's science will be based on two topics. Firstly, we will be working scientifically on a variety of tasks to learn about plants; their different parts, what they need to live and pollination. In the second half of the term, we will be focusing our scientific enquiries on different states of matter. We will be understanding solids, liquids and gases and working scientifically to develop and carry out our experiments.



DT (JH)

In DT this term we will be developing our skills with working with textiles. We will be developing sewing and applique techniques in order to create a cushion.

PE

Indoor PE (LW): Starting off with dance and learning to refine, repeat and remember dance phrases and dances. Then children will be working on a range of strength and stamina building exercises, including co-ordination. Understanding how strength, power and stamina help people to perform well in different athletic activities will help their skills improve.

Outdoor PE (JH): To start the term, we will be continuing to develop our techniques in cricket. We will be developing our fielding and striking techniques as well as learning to play together on teams and develop fairness within games.

PSHE and RE (CW)

In PSHE, we are going to be discussing the rights and responsibilities each child has, their place in taking care of the environment, and building an understanding about money.
